MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: Sarah Rosendahl

-When did you begin playing the flute and why did you choose this instrument?

I began playing the flute when I was ten years old. I watched a girl at church play every Sunday, and I just fell in love with the instrument. After much begging, my parents started renting a flute and got me private lessons. I continued to play, and joined band in high school!

-Describe your musical background.

I grew up in a musical family. My mom is a pianist, and my dad is a marching band guy. Ever since I can remember, I was tinkering on the piano and singing. Once I started playing the flute, I continued singing, and did some musical theatre in high school, before going on to college to study both flute and voice. After receiving my Bachelor's in Music Education, I went to SIUe and graduated with my Masters in Flute Performance last May!

-Do you have any musical highlights you would like to share and/or what is your most notable or personally satisfying accomplishment?

Probably my most notable accomplishment would be completing my Master's degree. I was working a full-time job and a part-time job in addition to working on that degree, and I was able to get it done in two years. It was a difficult couple of years, but I wouldn't trade the experiences, friendships, and accomplishments I gained for the world!

-Do you have a favorite practice routine? Can you describe it?

My favorite practice routine starts with long tones and technique. Usually, when I practice these, I turn reruns of my favorite TV show on. I do this because I find partially watching TV during technique helps it retain in my subconscious better! Anyway, I do long tones, then all my scales in extended range, then I choose a couple technique exercises from the Wye, Louke, or Kujala books and run through those. At that point, the TV goes off, and I dig into some pieces I am working on at that time. Lately, I've been playing around with some extended techniques and the Hue Fantasie!

-Describe any other hobbies you have.

I'm a weightlifter! I train at an advanced strength and conditioning gym before work three times a week, and I do some other fitness things on my own on the other days. I also have three dogs, so I love to walk them and snuggle with them! My husband and I enjoy movies too, particularly anything Marvel!

-What is your favorite style of music to listen to? to perform?

I listen to basically everything! On my phone, I have everything from Metallica and Dream Theater to Carrie Underwood, Fall Out Boy, and Sia. I also have an entire section of my music library dedicated to flute music, especially the stuff I'm currently working on, so I can listen to it in the car! As far as performing goes, definitely modern, extended technique pieces and French pieces are my favorites!

-Do you have any advice for aspiring flutists?

Don't let anyone tell you that you won't be successful. They will try, but it's up to you whether you achieve what you set out to achieve. One of my fitness mentors often says that the ten most dangerous words in the English language are "What will other people think? What will other people say?". So, it's up to you to decide where you will go and what you will do! Be humble, work hard, and be willing to take constructive criticism, and you will surprise yourself with what you can accomplish!

Meet our Flute Day Guest Artist ~ Jill Felber

JILL FELBER is an internationally acclaimed recording artist, dynamic flute recitalist, innovative chamber musician, legendary contemporary music specialist, and a distinguished flute professor who inspires and motivates students worldwide.

Jill Felber has been hailed for her "beautifully finished performances" by *The Detroit News* and has been praised by *Musical America* for her "handsome performance." The British journal *PAN* writes, "Felber was stunning...not only refined but also full of fun." "The incredible flutist...the dazzling flutist...the radiant flutist Jill Felber" (*The Independent*, Santa Barbara), is known to excite audiences everywhere in concerts and recitals "played with flair" (*The Los Angeles Times*). "The outstanding American flutist Jill Felber" (*Gazeta Rybnicka*, Poland) is acclaimed worldwide for her "consummate musicianship" (*Fanfare*).

Ms. Felber has performed solo recitals, chamber music, and concertos on five continents and has held residencies in Hong Kong, Taiwan, Australia, Mexico, France, Switzerland, Great Britain, Italy, Canada, Brazil and the United States. Also a tireless promoter of new music, Ms. Felber has inspired many composers to write solo and chamber works for her and for her flute duo ZAWA!, and is currently engaged in several commissioning projects. She has premiered over five hundred works for the flute and has released world premiere recordings for *Centaur Records*, *CRI*, *Neuma Records*, *BCM+D Records*, and *ZAWA!MUSIC*.

In demand as a guest clinician because of her extraordinary motivational teaching style, Ms. Felber is Professor of Flute at the University of California, Santa Barbara, where she earned the Distinguished Teaching Award. Highly regarded by her peers around the world, Ms. Felber currently presents her popular EXTREME MAKEOVER: FLUTE EDITION and WHOLE FLUTES® seminars throughout the country and frequently tours with pianist Dianne Frazer, showcasing their arranged "Fusions" at conventions, flute societies and universities. Holding degrees from University of Michigan and Bowling Green State University, Ms. Felber has taught on the faculties of Ohio University, Capital University, and Wright State University. Her teachers include Keith Bryan, Judith Bentley, Samuel Baron, and James Galway.

In addition to Ms. Felber's remarkable career performing and teaching with creativity and passion, she is also an effective leader in the field of arts administration. Having served as Chair of the Department of Music at UC Santa Barbara, she currently serves on the Board of Directors for Santa Barbara's Community Arts Music Association and on the Board of Directors for Areon Flutes. Professor Felber has been active in the National Flute Association, as a member of its Board of Directors for two terms, as Program Chair for the 1993 National Flute Association's conference in Boston, Massachusetts, and on several committees. As a founding member of the Flute and Clarinet Duo Consortium, she was a member of its initial Board of Directors with a mission to commission new works for flute and clarinet. Prior to moving to California, she served on the Board of Directors of the Detroit Contemporary Chamber Ensemble.
